Furthermore, granular fertilizers used on lawns are essentially salts that accelerate oxidation on spreaders and tractors. Powder coating creates a slick, chemically resistant surface. Grass is less likely to stick to the smooth polymer finish, which improves the airflow and cutting efficiency of the mower. If it does stick, a quick hose down removes it without the worry of water getting under the paint.

Restoring Vintage Garden Decor

Beyond machinery, many gardens feature vintage cast iron benches, urns, and birdbaths. These items add timeless beauty but require maintenance. Leaving them raw or poorly painted invites rust that can stain your patio pavers. Powder coating these items seals them completely. You can choose finishes that mimic aged copper (verdigris) or textured iron, preserving the antique look while providing modern protection. It allows you to leave your furniture out in the rain without anxiety.
